Series: Jesus: Prophet, Priest, and King

Sermon 1: King

Scripture: Revelation 19:11-16 (CSB)

1: The King Returns in _____ (v. 11)

- “Heaven opened” means this is God’s decisive intervention: the King is stepping onto the scene.
- The white horse declares victory, not vulnerability: Jesus returns as a Victor to judge sin.
- His names reveal His character: “Faithful and True”: He keeps every promise and is the source of all reality.
- He judges and makes war “with justice”: He will finally and decisively put an end to all evil and oppression.

2: The King Sees All and Bears Supreme Authority (vv. 12–13)

- His eyes like fire mean nothing is hidden (v. 12a): He sees public actions, private secrets, and internal motives.
- “Many crowns” mean unmatched sovereignty (v. 12b): Every earthly power, nation, and authority is ranked beneath Him.
- A name no one knows means He cannot be controlled (v. 12c): Jesus is not a manageable accessory; He is vast and incomprehensible.
- His blood-stained robe declares decisive victory (v. 13a): He moved toward sin and evil to defeat them personally.
- His name is “The Word of God” (v. 13b): When the King speaks, all of heaven backs His authority.

3: The King Conquers by His Word and Establishes His _____ Rule (vv. 14–15)

- The armies of heaven follow Him (v. 14): Jesus leads the way; the people of God are on the winning side.
- The sharp sword comes from His mouth (v. 15a): He wins by His Word and His decree, not by worldly weapons.
- “Strike the nations” means He deals with every rebellion (v. 15b): He will confront human pride and the defiance of the world.
- He “shepherds with an iron scepter” (v. 15c): His rule is perfectly balanced: Tender enough to care, strong enough to protect.
- The winepress image represents final _____ (v. 15d): Evil will not get an endless extension; God will put all things right.

Point 4: The King’s Identity Is _____ (v. 16)

- The title is written where everyone can see: There will be no debate, no spin, and no denial of who He is.
- “King of kings” means every ruler is beneath Him: The highest throne in the universe is the throne of Christ.
- “Lord of lords” means every _____ must answer to Him: Every spiritual force and earthly idol must bow.
- This title demands a response now, not later.
